

## APPLIED HOLISTIC NUTRITION DIPLOMA PROGRAM

The *Applied Holistic Nutrition Diploma* program provides a Diploma upon graduation and a Certified Nutritional Practitioner (CNP) certification. There are 564.5 ON-LINE – LIVE Lecture hours and a mandatory 100-hour Co-op placement totaling 664.5 program hours, with an additional 1500 hours of independent study including case studies and course work, and readings. The full-time program lasting approximately one year and part-time program lasting approx. two years. *Language of Instruction is English – Strictly on-line delivery.* 

#### **Program Details**

Institute of Holistic Nutrition On-Line Program includes LIVE lectures (except otherwise indicated), cooking classes, and our exclusive Co-operative placement program. Registration is open year-round; after registration, students may begin the next available course (as long as no prerequisite is required). Continuous students can complete the program in one year (full-time) or 2 years (part-time), but all students have up to 5 years to complete the Diploma in Applied Holistic Nutrition program. Evening part-time studies are completed via corresponding Daytime Lecture replayed on the evening schedule selected. Within this time frame, students must adhere to their registration schedule. All course content is delivered online. Should a student miss the LIVE lecture, a replay will be available for a limited time. Digital course notes are provided prior to the start of each course, ensuring the most up-to-date material is available.

## Payment Schedule Options (Current fees are applicable to students commencing the program in the year of 2026)

Upon registration, IHN-On-Line requires a CDN \$450 non-refundable tuition deposit/enrollment fee. Acceptable methods of payment are E-Transfer, Cheque, MasterCard, Visa and Money Order. All tuition invoices/receipts are emailed, unless requested otherwise. You have one opportunity to change your payment plan in relation to options B through C. No refunds are issued upon payment plan option changes.

Option A Payment in full of CDN \$6,995 + \$450 Deposit is required on day of registration for the complete On-Line IHN Applied Holistic Nutrition Diploma Program. This option is not available after the commencement of classes.

Option B Deposit/Enrollment fee due with registration: CDN \$450

2 installments (5-month intervals): CDN \$3,497.50 Payment plan fee: \$300 due with 1<sup>st</sup> installment

First installment is due two weeks before the beginning of Semester.

Option C Deposit due with registration: CDN \$450. Payment of tuition on a course-by-course basis is due on or prior to the first day of class. Please view IHN-On-Line's website or ask a Program Advisor for details. The course fees are subject to annual price increases, with the student paying the most current fee for a course. A change of payment plan C is permitted within the first 3 months and can only be changed to payment plan B.

## **Course Exemptions**

Official transcripts must be submitted before the commencement of the program in order for a tuition reduction to be processed for exemptions granted. Official transcripts submitted or request for exemption after the student commencement of the program will receive consideration for course exemption but will receive NO tuition credit.

- Students must retake any failed course in the next available session. Full charges of the current course price will apply and are due on or before the first class of the course.
- · Incomplete courses (dropping out of a course after the 30 percent mark) will be subject to full charges of the current course price on or before the first class of the course.
- · If a student wishes to retake a course that has already been successfully completed, payment of 50% of the current course fee is required.

- · All academic and financial obligations must be met before grade reports, transcripts, certificates and diplomas are issued and/or released.
- · For refund requests where the original credit card is no longer valid a 5% charge of the refunded amount will be levied.

## **Additional Considerations**

- The non-refundable registration deposit of CDN \$450 is valid up to one year, after which time the registration is null and void.
- Upon program commencement, the deposit, administrative fees, and tuition paid to date is valid up to five years from the program withdrawal date and may be used towards the regular diploma program only.
- If an individual withdraws, or does not pursue enrollment into courses, for over a period of five years, all Nutrition-related courses must be retaken due to the current nature of the course material.

Payment Option A & B: 100% refund up to one week after the commencement of Lectures, minus the non-refundable deposit of \$ 450, digital course notes; A 50% refund up to two weeks after the commencement of Lectures, minus the non-refundable deposit of \$ 450, digital course notes, and book purchases; No tuition refunds beyond these dates.

Refunds may require up to four weeks to process.

Payment Option C: 100% refund up to one week after the commencement of course or by the 30% drop by point of the individual course start date, minus the non-refundable deposit of \$450, digital course notes; No tuition refunds beyond these dates. Refunds may require up to four weeks to process.

#### • Official Exemptions

Applicants with credits from an accredited post-secondary educational institute may be exempt from certain health science courses only, provided that these credits meet IHN-On-Line's standards. Exemptions <u>may</u> be provided at the IHN-ON-LINE's discretion:

- Human Anatomy and Physiology (HAP01)
- Organic Chemistry (BC001)
- o Biochemistry (BM002)

Students who seek advanced standing must apply to an IHN Program Advisor with official transcripts from a recognized. post-secondary school a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the commencement of the program or individual course to receive exemption consideration. To receive a course exemption, two full semesters must be completed within the relevant program of study within the past ten years. An average of 70% or above in the related course is required. If advanced standing is granted prior to registration, a tuition deduction of the course exemption amount will be applied. Official transcripts submitted after the commencement of the program will receive consideration for course exemption but will receive no tuition credit.

- Graduation Eligibility Policy To qualify for the annual April graduation, please refer to the following assigned deadline of Feb
  15 to complete the following; required course work completion, including holistic food preparation and field trips (herb walk
  and farm trip) and the required Agreement/Evaluation Form completion totaling 100 Co-op hours submitted to your IHN Co-op
  advisor.
- Attendance Policy: A minimum 75% attendance in all courses is mandatory with the exception of PSD01, NR006, FSN013, AMB02 and CD011 (maximum of one day absence) and HFP04 (no allowable absence). Failure will result, regardless of grade, if the minimum attendance standard is not met. Students on probation are required to attend 90% of all classes. There is a zero-tolerance policy on absenteeism for placement practicum hours. Tardiness is disruptive to everyone and will not be tolerated. Students arriving late more than three times, in more than one course will be given a disciplinary letter of warning. Students who miss 30 minutes or more of class time in one day will be documented as a half class missed. Two missed half classes will total one complete session unattended.
- Tuition Fees Policy: Students are responsible for paying their tuition on time as per their contract. Missed or late payments are subject to 2.5% per week interest. Updates to credit card information are the responsibility of the student. All tuition and fees are due in Canadian currency.
- Academic Dismissal Policy: (Any dismissal/expulsion from the program results in no refund to the student) A student will be
  dismissed from the program after failing five different courses or the same course four times from the commencement of the
  program. Four consecutive semesters on Academic Probation are grounds for dismissal. Gross misconduct, as outlined in IHNOn-Line's Code of Conduct, will result in immediate dismissal without warning. Copyright, unauthorized distribution of
  program materials is grounds for immediate dismissal from the program without refund.
- Academic Probation Policy: Academic Probation is a status established in order to monitor a student's academic progress and
  assure professional competency upon graduation. A student will be placed on Academic Probation for failing three different
  courses, the same course twice, and/or arriving late more than three times in any two courses from the commencement of the
  program. Probation will result if a student fails to comply with the expectations outlined in IHN-On-Line's Code of Conduct.
  Academic Probation may be lifted after six months of active study.
- Academic Suspension Policy: Academic Suspension will result when a student fails four different courses or the same course
  three times from the commencement of the program. Failure to comply with IHN-On-Line's Code of Conduct may result in
  Academic Suspension. A student on Academic Suspension may return to their studies in six months' time on terms of Academic
  Probation for six months.
